Commonly Confused Words: Then vs. Than

Then and *than* sound a little alike, but their meanings are different.

Then can be an adverb meaning *in that case*, *in addition* or *in the next moment*. It can also be a noun meaning *a moment* or *specific time*.

Example 1: If Mike is late, **then** he should apologize.

Example 2: I did the dishes, **then** I went to bed.

Example 3: She was about to cross the road, **then** she saw a car.

Example 4: We will wait until **then** to call you.
